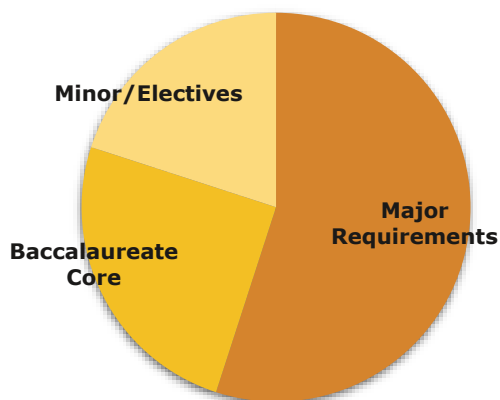

Sustainability Double Degree

Sustainability impacts all aspects of global business, politics, economics, and society, creating a need for leaders who have the skills and knowledge to address issues such as climate change, reliance on traditional energy sources, water issues, and the demand for socially and environmentally responsible products and services.

The B.S. in Sustainability is only available as a double degree. Current OSU students can complete the B.S. in addition to their primary degree program. The degree is designed to complement all OSU degree programs. For example, a student can major in Fisheries and Wildlife and then add the Sustainability Double degree to receive a B.S. in both areas of study.

Your Bachelor's Degree BS in the College of Agricultural Sciences



- A minimum of 212 credits are required for graduation with a primary degree and double degree; 60 must be upper division (300 and 400-level courses).
- A maximum of 135 transfer credits may be applied toward a bachelor's degree at OSU.
- Only courses with letter prefixes and numbers above 100 can be accepted.
- Some courses can count towards your major and the Baccalaureate Core. Check with your advisor.

- Sustainability students complete a Practicum, which may be fulfilled by an internship, research, study abroad, or an alternative spring break project.
- Sustainability Double Degree program students may join a variety of relevant clubs on campus, including Waster Watchers, or consider getting involved with the OSU Sustainability Office.
- Courses that count toward a primary major of your choice and some Baccalaureate Core courses are priority courses to complete before transferring to OSU.
- Students can transfer and begin Sustainability coursework any term, but should ask the best time to transfer based on their primary major and its requirements.
- It is important to speak with the Sustainability Advisor early on, and often, to ensure correct course selection and sequencing. The Sustainability advisor can be reached at sus.advising@oregonstate.edu.

- Students do not have to complete a transfer degree in order to transfer to OSU.
 - If you've completed the Oregon AAOT, all requirements of the Baccalaureate Core are complete except for Synthesis Courses and Writing Intensive Courses.
