Got Lygus bugs ?



- Small sucking bugs, brown to green and less than 0.25 inch long.
- They cause minor damage of unknown economic significance.
- Damage commonly consists of flagging of leaflets, leaves, or small stems.
- Chemical treatment for lygus bugs in potatoes probably is rarely needed.

Late blight has been confirmed north of Pasco and west of Burbank. The Burbank field was confirmed this last week and this week the third field was confirmed north of Pasco.
