PSA Updates

1) New- The PSA team has released several new resources including a

fruit and vegetable food safety training video for field employees and a factsheet on agricultural water system inspection differences from the proposed agricultural water assessment. The videos can be viewed on the PSA YouTube channel, and the factsheet can be viewed on the general resource page on the PSA website.

- 2) **New-** Spanish Online Grower Training Pilot: The PSA team will be hosting the first Spanish language online PSA Grower Training in August 2023. The Online PSA Grower Training Course is the same curriculum as the in-person PSA Grower Training Course, but offered in an online, asynchronous, 3-week session through eCornell. The pilot Spanish-language online course includes self-check quizzes and six required discussions that can be completed at the participants' own pace. The online course is expected to take 15-30 hours total for successful completion. If you are interested in participating in the pilot course, please reach out to <u>Yulie Meneses</u>.
