Highlights from Recent Meetings

1) WRCEFS Annual Meeting and Pre-Meeting Professional Development Workshop

WRCEFS hosted its 6th Annual Meeting in Las Cruces, New Mexico on May 4-5, 2022. During the two day in-person meeting, 50 attendees heard updates from WRCEFS members and FSOP grant awardees in the Western Region, USDA, FDA, PSA, FSPCA, IFAI, sister Regional Centers and the Lead Regional Coordination Center. On day one, updates on the peer review process for add-ons and evaluations were also shared. Over the two day meeting, the group learned about several regional topics of interest including, what's new and relevant with the Produce Safety Rule, food safety challenges at the border, and a recall readiness essentials workshop and template. Several breakout sessions were also held focusing on agricultural water and working with underserved audiences. Highlights from the 2022 Annual Meeting are coming soon!

Prior to the Annual Meeting, a pre-meeting produce safety professional development workshop was held on May 3, 2022. The 30 workshop attendees started off the day with an agricultural water assessment scavenger hunt, transitioned into cleaning and sanitizing scenarios for produce farms and packing facilities, and ended the day with learning about a new recall essentials plan builder.

2) National FSOP PD Meeting

The Lead Regional Coordination Center, along with the four USDA-NIFA regional centers, hosted the 2022 Food Safety Outreach Program Project National Project Director's Meeting. The project directors met May 25-26 in Orlando, FL and virtually. The program booklet is available on the <u>Southern Center website</u>.

Training and Resource Updates

- 1) More than Words Illustrations- The PSA has developed a series of illustrations to communicate concepts related to the Produce Safety Rule (PSR) without the use of text. These illustrations allow growers to consider risks they may have on their farms, practices that could reduce these risks, and regulatory provisions that may be relevant if they are subject to the FSMA PSR. The 14 images currently available on the PSA website are accompanied by an illustration guide and teaching notes. Within these documents, you can also find relevant FSMA references, relevant resources, and notes on where these can be used in PSA Grower Trainings.
- 2) PSA has extended its temporary remote delivery policy for the PSA Grower Training and PSA Train-the-Trainer courses to **December 31, 2022** due to the continuing COVID-19 pandemic. For more information on remote delivery of courses, please review the <u>PSA remote training policy</u>. This policy was recently updated (April 2022) to address use of participant smartphones.
