FY 2021 FSOP Grantees Announced



Produce GAPs Harmonized Standard Auditor Training

The United Fresh Produce Association is hosting a virtual produce GAPs Harmonized Standard auditor training on October 18th-21st. This course utilizes the official training materials developed by the Produce GAPs Harmonization Initiative Calibration Committee, designed to standardize food safety auditors' use and expectations of the combined, Pre- and Post-harvest Harmonized Standards. This training is sponsored by the National Farmers Union.

While specifically targeted towards auditors who offer audits/certifications to the Harmonized Standard, this training is open to all audit organization members, growers, and other interested parties using the harmonized standards.


WRCEFS FSPCA PCHF and PSA Training

Add-on Peer Review Process- Now Open

The Western Regional Center to Enhance Food Safety in collaboration with the Northeast Center to Advance Food Safety (NECAFS) has been working on a peer review process for add-on content that will be facilitated through the Clearinghouse.

Add-ons are material(s) in addition to standardized curricula that are developed and delivered pre-course, during a course, or post-course as a standalone.

We are excited to announce that the peer review system is **open and accepting submissions**. At this time, only resources in English are being accepted for peer review. Additional detailed instructions and

2) New- Spanish-language Produce Safety Educator's group launch.

PSA is launching a Spanish-language Produce Safety Educator's group. Similar to the English Produce Safety Educators' Group, the Produce Safety Educators' Group in Spanish has the purpose of

keeping PSA Trainers, PSA Lead Trainers, PSA Trainers-of-Trainers and produce safety educators, specifically those who are focused on produce safety outreach and extension, up to date on the latest educational resources, training opportunities, regulatory updates, and produce industry initiatives.

Beginning Wednesday, September 22, 2021, PSA will host a webinar each month. These webinars are expected to last one hour and will be held via Zoom. The first webinar discussed the PSA, its policies, and relevant training updates.

This group is open to anyone interested in produce safety education but may be most relevant to PSA Trainers and Lead Trainers conducting trainings in Spanish as well as extension educators from the United States and Latin America.

4) New- Requirements to Becoming a PSA Trainer:

Effective **October 1, 2021**, all individuals interested in enrolling in a PSA Train-the-Trainer course must have attended at least one registered PSA Grower Training course. Successfully completing an <u>inperson, online, or remote PSA Grower Training Course</u> meets this requirement. During the PSA TTT, Trainers-of-Trainers (ToTs) emphasize how to teach the PSA GT Course curriculum, effectively engage participants, and navigate training challenges to ensure a high-quality training, so there is an expectation that attendees already know the curriculum content. Participants that have not attended a PSA GT Course prior to the PSA TTT Course will not be eligible for a certificate of completion and will not be PSA Trainers.
