Ag Water Treatment TTT Workshop

The Ag Water Treatment Train-the-Trainer Workshop is scheduled for October 13, 2020 from 1:00 PM to 5:00 PM PST and October 14, 2020

from 8:00 AM to 12:00 PM. This two day workshop is designed for extension and industry professionals who wish to teach courses on preharvest agricultural water treatment.

Registration for the course was capped at 30 participants. Course registration opened on August 28th and seats filled up within 1 hour! Due to the high demand for this workshop, the Western Regional Center is looking into bringing this training back to our region in the spring of 2021.

This workshop was created by North Carolina State University, University of Arizona, University of Florida, University of Georgia, University of Tennessee, Virginia Cooperative Extension, and Washington State University.


1) Food Safety and Wildfires

The goal of this project was to build upon the food safety outreach program at the Oregon State University (OSU) to address knowledge and resource gaps in delivering standardized Produce Safety Alliance (PSA) training to the produce industry in Oregon. FDA Updates

1) Employee Health and Food Safety Checklist for Human and Animal Food Operations During the COVID-19 Pandemic

On August 19th, the FDA and OSHA released a checklist for FDA-regulated human and animal food operations to use when assessing operations during the COVID-19 pandemic, especially when re-starting operations after a shut down or when reassessing operations because of changes due to the COVID-19 public health emergency caused by the virus SARS-CoV-2. 2) FDA Requests Information on Expansion of the Rarely Consumed Raw List for Uncommonly Consumed Produce

FDA issued a Request for Information (RFI) to open a docket for data and information related to produce that has been known to have no or low reported consumption. The Agency will use the data and information to consider whether any of these produce commodities should be added to the "rarely consumed raw" (RCR) list and thereby exempt from the Produce Safety rule. The items currently on the exhaustive RCR list are not subject to the requirements in the Produce Safety rule. Beginning August 10th, the FDA will be collecting information from the public for 90 days and invites those with data, information, and/or comments on consumption of produce that is rarely consumed raw to submit it through the Request for Information (RFI) docket.
